



The SydWest Backswing Project

The SydWest Backswing project is a creative job preparation and employer engagement program, designed for people with a disability, including those from a multicultural background to improve economic participation.

What's the project about?

The Backswing projects, each driven by a team of participants, will create communication tool for employers to better onboard people with a disability. Each project is developed by people with disability themselves and takes place over 18 weeks.

The projects aim is to support and inspire employers to better onboard people with a disability in industries like Hospitality, Retail, Warehouse and Logistics, and Health Care and Social Assistance in Western Sydney.

The outcome

The aim is to raise awareness of the benefits of employing people with disability from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds among employers and the general community in Western Sydney.

Participants will gain real-life work experience, develop employability skills that employers want, build a supportive network, and learn the skills to apply successfully for opportunities.

Employer Engagement

Each project team will liaise with representatives of industries who will oversee the project and support the team to stay on track. While a dedicated trainer will help each Backswing team develop the project, participants take responsibility for organising it.
